HARVEST NOTES

In Santa Barbara, the 2021 vintage provided a good growing season with ideal ripening weather. Tyler Thomas, winemaker at Dierberg Vineyard, noted cool mornings, ample fog, and no significant heat events. The vintage progressed smoothly with yields matching historical averages. Wines are showing excellent flavor depth, lower alcohol levels, and higher acidity. "We are very excited about the ability to promote energy in wines with terrific depth and generosity," says Thomas.

Winemaker Notes

Weather during the ripening period was about as ideal as you could ask for in Santa Barbara County in 2021, with little-to-no heat events. The fog was ample in the mornings which helped push our harvest in the Sta. Rita Hills out a couple of weeks and I think contributed to great depth while we were able to maintain acidity. Our technique with this wine was consistent with the previous vintage and consistent with maximizing Drum Canyon: whole-cluster pressing, and an anaerobic ML which helps the wine achieve texture without butter.
